NO INTEREST LOANS SCHEME (NILS)

No Fees
 No Interest
 Ever

Nils have made some changes to make it easier and more affordable to get a loan!

As of 1st July 2022:

- You can now borrow up to \$2000 and repay over up to 24 months
- The loan purpose has increased and you can now get a loan for Rent Advance, Bond Rent arrears (by exception) and Utilities (DV only)
- The income threshold has increased and you are eligible if you earn up to \$57,000 net (single) or \$75,000 net couple/ dependents
- There is no income threshold for DV clients
- Applying for a loan will be easier, without the need for as many documents!
- You can 'top up' your loan if you have been paying your loan for 90 days without missing a payment
- We can organize direct debit
- We can provide loans to any one in Australia who meets the criteria, so you don't have reside in Forster -Tuncurry

How to apply:

- Come into the Forster Neighbourhood Centre at 1 Coral Avenue, Tuncurry and pick up an application pack
- Contact the office via phone (6555 4351) or email <u>admin@fnc.org.au</u> and we can email you the application pack
- Head to our website <u>www.fnc.org.au</u> and apply on-line or download the application pack

Once you have all your documents, phone the office to book an interview with our Loans Officers Rachel and Liahna.

Food security

It's understandable that under COVID-19 there are many more people relying on food hampers. *Please don't go hungry.*

- Fresh food and bread from The Salvation Army in South Street on Tuesdays and Fridays from 11.30 am to 1.00pm. Enquiries 6557 2076.
- Lunch is provided from the Catholic Church Hall in Lake Street on Wednesdays & Thursday between 12noon and 1pm. Enquiries:6554 6401
- Pantry Item/Food packages can be picked up from the Neighbourhood Centre, 1 Coral Avenue Tuncurry, Monday to Friday.

We try to be discrete and understand that this is the first time you may have had to ask for help. Ring ahead and we can have it ready for you (but we will ask your surname, year of birth, children's ages how many you are feeding - this will help us tailor the food package to your requirements and to ensure that the same people are not coming every week, making it available for more in need). Enquiries 6555 4351.

FAPA - help paying your electricity bills is available from the State Department of Industry through Service NSW and/or the Forster Neighbourhood Centre can help you with your application. Residents can apply for up to \$400 twice a year - especially if you have been financially impacted by COVID-19. You must reside in the premises that is named on the electricity bill and you must have a current bill to apply... preferably before the due date, so you can still get your 'pay on time' discount. - Child health and wellbeing information




- Activities that develop children's life skills,

What is Better Learning Better Communities?

BLBC is a tutoring program for primary age Aboriginal students, run by Forster Neighbourhood Centre. The program is delivered in partnership with Homebase Youth Services and Tobwabba Aboriginal Medical Service, developed by Elders and the community and delivered by volunteers.

When is Tutoring Held?

BLBC is based at Tobwabba Aboriginal Medical Services every Monday afternoon of term. Every child is welcome. We work one-on-one on whatever each child is most interested in, be it writing, reading, maths or homework.

Our aim is to encourage kids to do the best they can, and to make learning fun so they want to come back each week. All our tutors have Working With Children Checks and are carefully trained in how to support Koori kids in their learning. We learn, eat and play games together!
