Forster Neighbourhood Centre has a new home!

After a long period of inadequate premises, Forster Neighbourhood Centre can finally say it has a new home! Opening on Monday 20 March, 2023 at 3 Lake Street, Forster (the old bottlo next to the Lakes and Oceans), Forster Neighbourhood Centre welcomes the whole community to come visit the new centrally located hub.


The new premises is a Council owned building provided at subsidised commercial rent for up



to 5 years for use by Forster Neighbourhood Centre. The site was essentially a bare shed and with the support of government grants, the site has been fit-out as a central community hub complete with a community meeting room, interview rooms and a safe place for all Great Lakes residents to reach out for support. The purpose built fit-out was proudly funded by the NSW Government in association with the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal and the Forster Neighbourhood Centre.

Forster Neighborhood Centre has operated continuously in the community for over 40 years. Their new home provides the capacity needed to meet the growing demand for support and services. With the rising cost of living, the Centre is experiencing unprecedented requests for support reaching almost 100 requests per week.

We enjoy the support of local businesses Club Forster, Eastern Tiger Restaurant, Butterfingers Bakery, Evermore and Quota to meet this demand however having the space to store and distribute these generous donations is a game changer. It has taken a whole of community approach to deliver this asset to the community, thank you to all our supporters.

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING?

There has been plenty happening for the first part of 2023. Besides moving to our new purpose - built premises, here are just a few of the highlights:

Worimi Women Cultural Camps

We were successful in receiving funding from the NSW Government and Regional Arts NSW to work alongside the local Worimi community to build the capacity for cultural knowledge sharing over time through a series of Cultural Camps. In February, we held the first community consultation for the project with the first



camp planned for May 2023. Proudly funded by the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund in association with the Regional Arts Fund NSW and the Forster Neighbourhood Centre.

Aim High

Facilitated by Tanika Davis and Kitana Paulson, the Aim High project delivered a series of school holiday activities in April including Art workshops, NRL clinics, Surf Awareness/Learn to Surf and Fishing workshops. Up to 30 local Aboriginal children attended each day, learning new skills and developing talent in a new area.

The Aim High project is funded by the Children and Young People Wellbeing Initiative.

MidCoast Aboriginal Action Plan

Our Program Officer, Kitana Paulson represented Forster Neighbourhood Centre at community consultations on the MidCoast Council Aboriginal Action Plan. Over two days, community members came together to provide feedback into the plan.

Better Learning Better Communities

Our tutoring program continued during Term 1, held at Tobwabba AMS. BLBC is a one-on-one tutoring program where Aboriginal children and tutors work together in ways the children want to learn. Learning together, BLBC provides an opportunity for mutual respect and trust to build between tutors and children, enhancing learning outcomes for the children.

The Market is on the 3rd Saturday of each month 8.00am - 12noon. In the grounds of the Visitor Information Centre, Little Street Forster.

The Forster Farmers Market supports over 20 regular local producers to sell their fresh produce direct to the public.


Aim High

An overview of this year's April School Hoidays:

We ran four workshops this school holidays coordinated by our Project Coordinator, Tanika Davis and Program Officer, Kitana Paulson. The workshops included:

- Aboriginal Art workshop led by local Worimi Artist, Brittney Paulson
- NRL Clinic led by Newcastle Knights WNRL players Caitlan Johnston, Kyra Simon and Caitlin Moran
- Surf Awareness/Surfing Clinic led by Dave Rankin and Simon Basil (Great Lakes Surf School) supported by local community

member Kyla Simon and staff from Homebase Youth Services



As an additional activity to nurture the artistic talent of the children, the Aim High project is supporting a local initiative called Buuranbal Marray.

Buuranbal Marray (Spirit Dreaming) Art Exhibition 2023

By creating the Buuranbal Marray Art Gallery we plan to shine a light on the stories that are part of Worimi Dreaming (and stories of truth-telling from history within the Worimi community). We aim to encourage as many Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as we can to engage, share and celebrate different aspects of Culture as part of the journey to the exhibition date. The exhibition during the NAIDOC period will be the end point but it is the journey to this time that holds the key to achieving our goal. Listening to Elders, visiting places of significance 'On Country', reading the literature available in books and online, and learning how to create stories through art will provide the opportunities for Cultural sharing and learning along the way. The event will be the culmination of learning with a particular focus for this year on stories through art. It involves a range of age groups across the community and depending on the age and experiences of the participants, Buuranbul Marray would require participants to either share or strengthen their knowledge of those stories that are significant within the Worimi community.

The Buuranbal Marray Art Exhibition will provide a platform for our school communities and members of the wider community to learn about and celebrate the Culture and story of the Worimi people and nation through the stories they share. This exhibition will raise the awareness of non-indigenous visitors to the gallery of the rich Cultural knowledge, skills and history that exists, and the positive work within our community to partner with the Worimi community towards Reconciliation.

Food security

It's understandable that under COVID-19 there are many more people relying on food hampers. *Please don't go hungry.*

- Fresh food and bread from The Salvation Army in South Street on Tuesdays and Fridays from 11.30 am to 1.00pm. Enquiries 6557 2076.
- Lunch is provided from the Catholic Church Hall in Lake Street on Wednesdays & Thursday between 12noon and 1pm. Enquiries:6554 6401
- Pantry Item/Food packages can be picked up from the Neighbourhood Centre, 3 Lake St Forster Monday to Friday.

We try to be discrete and understand that this is the first time you may have had to ask for help. Ring ahead and we can have it ready for you (but we will ask your surname, year of birth, children's ages how many you are feeding - this will help us tailor the food package to your requirements and to ensure that the same people are not coming every week, making it available for more in need). Enquiries 6555 4351.

EAPA - help paying your electricity bills is available from the State Department of Industry through Service NSW and/or the Forster Neighbourhood Centre can help you with your application. Residents can apply for up to \$400 twice a year - especially if you have been financially impacted by COVID-19. You must reside in the premises that is named on the electricity bill and you must have a current bill to apply... preferably before the due date, so you can still get your 'pay on time' discount.
